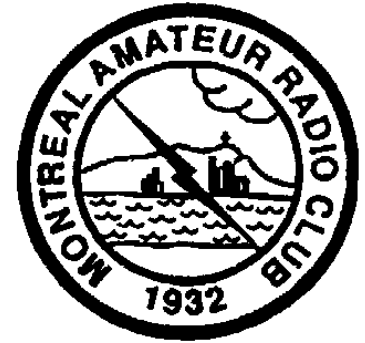

TOPHAT 2002 PLANNED FOR APRIL 6TH

Tophat 2002, an emergency communications competition for British Columbia's Lower Mainland and Fraser Valley regions is set for April 6th, 2002. Teams of 10, representing various municipalities, compete in an emergency scenario, including set-up and standard operating procedures, formal messaging, and problem solving. Teams

staff their municipal EOC, hospital, reception centre and one surprise remote location. The scenario is announced at the start of the exercise and is based on an actual event in Canadian history.

Last year, 140 amateurs representing 13 municipalities formed 10 teams. Tophat 2001 was based on the 1945 ship explosion in Vancouver harbour.

While the competition is limited to teams in British Columbia, any other group that wants to participate in their municipality using the same scenario and problems can contact the Tophat design team for further information.

SOLAR DOUBLE HEADER !

The NOAA Space Environment Center in the US is predicting that the current solar cycle (Number 23) will be a double header. Solar flux and sunspot numbers peaked in the year 2000 and started to decrease, but recent increased activity on the sun has driven the 27 cm flux to new highs, and will result in a second maximum around the beginning of 2002.

Good news for HF propagation as the higher frequency HF bands will be open more and for a longer period of time before we drop back to the sunspot minimum. For more details visit NASA science news at

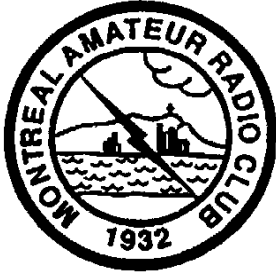

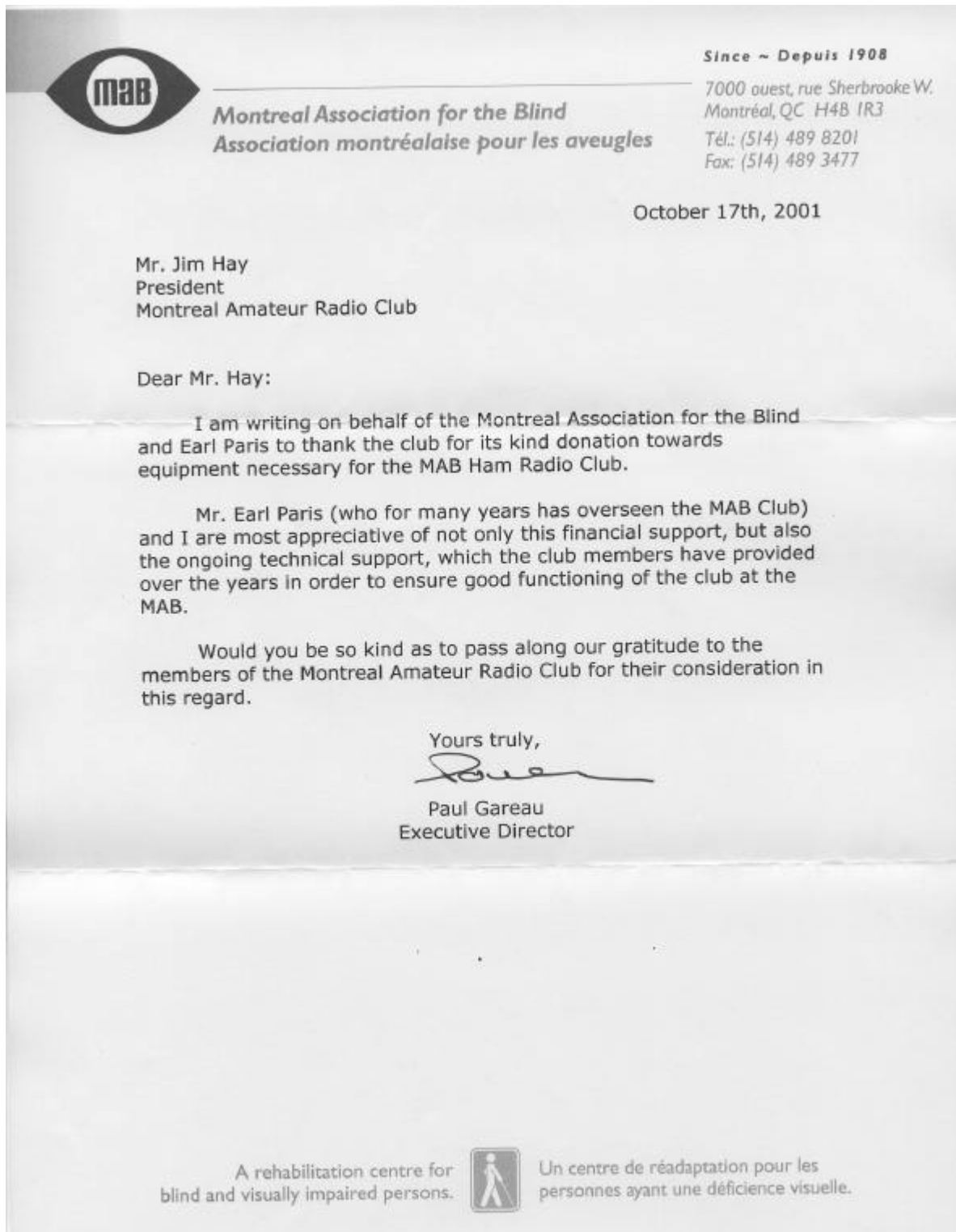
