LOGBOOK OF THE WORLD COMING SOON

ARRL's "Logbook of the World" (LOTW) electronic contact-verification program will spark "a culture change" when it's introduced later this year, predicts Project Manager Wayne Mills, N7NG. Once LOTW is operational, participants will be able to qualify for awards such as DXCC or WAS without having to first secure verification in the form of hard-copy QSL cards. But Mills--who heads ARRL's Membership Services Department--is quick to add that LOTW will complement the conventional exchange of QSL cards, not replace it.

Logbook of the World "is really a system to offer credits for awards--and not just our awards," Mills explained. He hopes to enlist the participation of other organisations that grant operating awards, such as CQ and RSGB. Central to the LOTW concept is a huge repository of constantly updated log data provided by individual DXers, contesters and DXpeditions and maintained by ARRL. Once it's up and running, Logbook of the World will be able to provide quick contact credit. Mills adds that the system will be open to all--ARRL members and nonmembers.

Registering and uploading electronic log data to LOTW will be free. The only time users will incur charges is when they wish to apply contact credits toward a particular award, such as DXCC, WAS or VUCC. Mills said he hopes to announce an inauguration date for Logbook of the World within a few months. (thanks to ARRL letter)

UKRS CEASES OPERATIONS

The United Kingdom Radio Society, Britain's alternative amateur radio representative body, has ceased operation. The UKRS was set up to provide an alternative to the long-established Radio Society of Great Britain. The departure of two members of the UKRS' governing body left the organisation under strength, and dependent on its two co-founders, who did not wish to effectively start over again. AUSTRALIAN VIEW ON ARRL PROPOSED NOVICE BAND RESTRUCTURE

The possibility of American amateurs being allowed to use SSB lower down in the HF bands moved a step closer with the American Radio Relay League planning to file a proposal with the Federal Communications Commission.

As things currently stand, the US has large CW allocations on its HF bands. These, in part, provided bandspace for the formerly CW-only novice licence. Declining activity on these segments and the abolition of the Novice licence have led to plans to reallocate these frequencies and provide more room for other modes. In particular, the League is proposing expanded phone

allocations on 40 and 80 metres.

If the change goes ahead, it will not affect Australian amateurs on eighty metres. This is because the ARRL plan calls for the SSB segment to be extended down to 3.725 MHz, whereas (apart from the DX window), the Australian eighty metre band stops at 3.700 MHz. On forty metres the only change will be that we will start hearing US SSB operators down to 7.125 MHz. This compares to current activity, where US operators commonly operate just above 7.150 MHz. (Thanks to ARRL Letter and APC News Australia)

SCANNERS HEAR IT FIRST

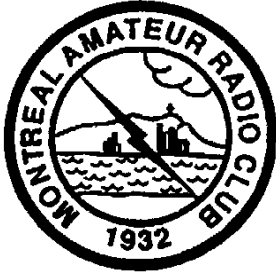
Kiss me I'm Irish! (Actually tinted scotch) Only women need apply, no males please! March is upon us, the snow is almost gone but as I write there are white giant flakes falling heavily. They are calling for 10 centimetres. I say call back and order spring sunshine instead! (PS. Did I mention no males please?)

Monitoring has been abundant this month and there are a few new pieces to the regional puzzle. The first is a new simplex 800 MHz frequency that combines EDACS with APCO 25 and enables everyone on the island to communicate amongst themselves on the fireground at scenes. This talk-around frequency is low power simplex on 867.5125. I was able to pick up fireground traffic of the SSIM at a fire scene 1-1/2 kilometres from my home QTH with no problem so keep this one in memory as it is island wide. All 28 municipality fire services are now heard on 412.7625 at the moment with the new on scene 867.5125. The SSIM has been quite busy again with the help of mother nature and a recipe of ice and wind (104 km/h). Saturation! of the main fire dispatch frequency of SSIM withstood 18 hours of continuous calls that in my opinion sounded even busier than the ice storm of '98. Lucky for the SSIM there were no major fires break out in that wind because "conflagration" would have been the word of the day.

The rumour mill still spins as always. Some of the more interesting ones are an all 800 MHz/non-trunked system is near for SSIM... (I like this one, no trunk-tracker needed). Multiple dispatch frequencies for sectioning the island into two or three regions (the saturation of the windy weekend will help prove this one helpful).

Request: Again we are on the lookout for new 800 MHz frequencies in Laval. The fire/police have left the 900 MHz system of ELYPS and have moved onto Bell Mobility EDACS but not on the present group of repeaters in the area. Anyone that can listen up in Laval and come up with frequencies/talk groups/sites are welcome to share with us here at VE2ARC@RAC.CA. I'm sure it won't take long to find the info out.

Urgence Sante has now added radio bases to the Sacre Coeur Hospital (Cartierville) and the Montreal General (downtown) in their trauma departments. Major accident traffic off the Ridgewood hub of frequencies can be heard as the EMS crews advise the trauma centres as to what they are about to receive. Talk group 02-090. Interesting chatter as this type of traffic has operated in most major U.S. cities for the last 25 years. Experimental systems were tried at Royal Victoria and Jewish General Hospitals in the mid to

This was confirmed to my ears when I heard two non-EMS units tell each other to go to 10-52 and the dispatcher at SSIM came on and proclaimed 10-52 is for medical first response calls only.

That's it for another issue. Keep listening and getting those earfuls and as time passes those who can't understand the lingo will get better at it. You just have to have patience and a good scanner.
